PARISH SYNOD REPORT

Question #2: What did participants have to say about areas where the Church is in need of healing and conversion.

The scandals in the Church, in particular the sexual abuse and the indigenous schools' history, have affected many people. It is causing some people to leave, to stay away.

Even people who have left the Church expressed a strong faith and belief in God, and a strong reliance on prayer.

Some people felt the Church, as an institution, lacks humility. It is hierarchical, patriarchal, with a sense of being better than others. There is a need to accept unconditional responsibility for serious past and present errors, not "circle the wagons" or "lawyer up".

There is a need for transparency and explanation for decisions and actions. What happened needs to be explained. This needs to continue on an on-coming basis.

Reconciliation is one of the sacraments of the Church. The Church needs to follow its own process of reconciliation to deal with these errors – acknowledge the error, own it, express sorrow.
