62.6% High or Essential Priority;

3.7% Neutral or unsure.

34.0% High or Essential Priority;

38.7% Somewhat a priority or Moderate priority;

6.6% Low priority or not a priority;

20.8% Neutral or unsure.

To what extent would you say your parish gives priority (or not) to ministering to people with disabilities or special needs?:

38.0% High or Essential Priority:

25.9% Somewhat a priority or Moderate priority;

10.2% Low priority or not a priority;

25.9% Neutral or unsure.

23.8% High or Essential Priority;

32.4% Somewhat a priority or Moderate priority;

10.5% Low priority or not a priority;
